
There will be entertainment, and short comments.

#### 18th Mational Conference of the Order of the Arrow held at the University of Illianis

Tuesday, August 20, 1963, marked the opening of one of the finest conformes ever. As it began with registration at the mushroom shaped assembly hall, many old acquaintances were revived and many new ones were formed.

The evening program statted in the darkened assembly hall with every member --about 3500--holding a lighted candle in the spirit of brotherhood. Following the opening ceremony, the greetings of state and university officials, and the instillation of Bob Elisperman as our National Conference Chief, we listened intently to the keynote address which was delivered by Frank Bush, Arrowman, Eagle Scout, Honor student, and Chairman of the First National Explorer Delegate Conference. He urged all to "live our lives cheerfully with brotherhood in service and, above all, with honor and personal dignity," while emphasizing the conference theme -- Catch the higher vision.

The bulk of the conference consisted of such activities as the O.A. Olympics. where everyone had a chance to participate in any form of fourteen different sports; Indian pageant, a variety of Indian dances and customs, the camperaft fair which consisted of displays and demonstrations of everything from cooked alligator tail to beadwork; a quarter mile of exhibits on Indian Lore, Scouting's history, the armed forces, and so on; and a variety show where we were entertained by Arrowmen and the lovely Judith Schlieper, Miss Illinois

Probably one of the most valuable portion of the conference was the discussion groups Scout executive. Each year and workshops where everyone exchanged ideas and worked with theories on everything from the Ordeal to Alpha Phi Omega.

And Friday the Conference came to a close with the presentation of thirteen Distinguished Service Awards, one of which was awarded to our own Dwayne Welling; the resolutions of the Conference; and the challenge by Dr. E. Urner Goodman, co-founder of the Order of the Arrow. To close I would like to quote J. A. Brunton Jr., as he said, "It is yours to transmit the thrill of the outdoors and the zest of fitness, looking to strenghtening America

and the fulfillment of Scoutings high purpose." This, I feel, is a great challange to catch the higher vision, a challange for every Arrowman.
